2023 Final Taxes

Due September 22nd & November 24th

Credit Card, Interac or E-transfer | Available online at www.howick.ca through PaySimply.ca, a transaction fee is applicable.

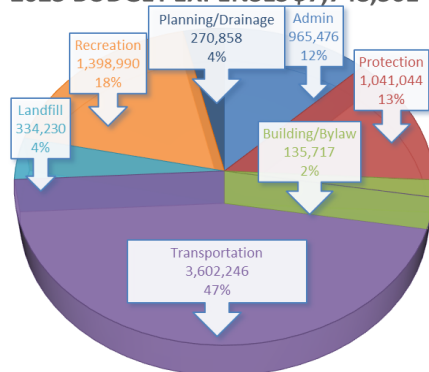
Payment at Bank | Available through most major banking institutions. Use your property roll-number as the Account Number.

Treasury

A municipal levy of \$4,026,924 is required this year to meet the needs of the Township for 2023. This represents a levy increase of \$282,363 (7.01%) funds to be raised over the previous year which also translates into a 5.47% tax rate increase over the previous year. In 2023 we had an increase of 6.2% of funds for our OMPF funding from the province, with other costs remaining relatively stable. We are happy to have 2 new additional staff join the Township this year as well. The complete budget may be found at www.howick.ca under the Treasury Department.

Rebates and Loan Programs

Farm Property Class Tax Rate Program If you have a valid Farm Business Registration you are eligible for the Farm Tax Incentive Program. Farmland is then taxed at 25% of the residential tax rate. Ensure your registration with Agricorp is current.

Tile Drain Loan Program This program assists farm owners with agricultural drainage. Applications and additional information available at the Township office. Current loans have a 10 year term with a 6% interest rate
