

HOWICK DAYCARE PLANNING COMMITTEE

Township staff are pleased to share that discussions with the Huron County Children's Services Division have been ongoing regarding the potential creation of a Childcare facility in Howick Township.

As the Service System Manager for the Canada-Wide Early Learning and Child Care (CWELCC) agreement, Huron County has funds available to distribute to its lower tier municipalities for the development of new childcare spaces. Funds are available to assist with the capital costs of building a daycare facility and its ongoing operational expenses. Howick Township has been identified as one of the remote communities within Huron County with emerging needs due to population growth and limited access to existing childcare services.

At the July 15, 2025 Regular Council Meeting, Howick Council passed a motion approving the creation of a childcare centre planning committee comprised of township staff, 1-2 members of Council and 3-5 members of the public to determine the feasibility and sustainability of a licenced childcare centre in Howick, and to begin developing a business plan and a facility drawings.

The funding requirement to complete construction by year end 2026 gives Howick a short window of time if we want to make this centre a reality!

PUBLIC WORKS

They say in Ontario we have two seasons, winter and construction. As we enter peak summer season, the public works department is happy to announce that the paving project in the 2025 budget for Fordwich will begin soon. Brookhaven Drive will be paved between Patrick Street and Victoria Street. Albert Street will be paved between Patrick Street and Arthur Street as well as a small section of Creamery Road where a road crossing took place. Watch for an anticipated start date on the Township social media channels.

Gorrie Line will be closed from Howick-Turnberry Road to Glenannon Road beginning August 1, 2025 to September 1, 2025 for a culvert replacement.

HURON COUNTY WORK CONTINUES IN HOWICK

Howick-Turnberry Road (County Road 7) culvert replacement has been completed, shoulder gravel has started with paving to follow. Howick-Turnberry Road will remain open during the paving process. When driving in a construction zone, it is crucial to follow essential safety guidelines to minimize risk and ensure the safety of yourself and others on the road. Everyone wants to get home safe.

The Wroxeter Bridge on County Road 87 is also under construction. Huron County has construction staged to allow for one lane of traffic to always remain open. Alternating traffic will be directed by traffic lights. There is a width restriction of 4 meters on the bridge. Please proceed with caution and obey all signage.

Queen of the Vines is a title that has been bestowed by many to the Clematis family of vines. These vines are prolific, producing masses of flowers, available in a wide variety of colour and bloom size

The pink Montana variety pictured here has blooms about two inches in diameter. The white Toki also pictured here has flowers almost six inches across.

Sweet summer love also pictured here is covered in reddish purple flowers and has proved itself to be very hardy.

Sweet autumn is a very vigorous grower reaching up to twenty five feet. At the opposite end of the size scale are bush clematis, variety

Stand by me, shown here with bell shaped flowers. The plants are barely two feet high.

The native clematis is known by several different common names, virgins bower, ragged robin, old man's beard to name a few, and can be seen growing on the roadside, climbing over stumps, shrubs and trees. The flowers are inconspicuous but the seed heads are quite attractive.

With the exception of the bush clematis all require something to climb on, trellis, tree trunk, fence post, step

ladder or obelisk. Generally they require little maintenance and with the wide range of colours available a Queen of the Vines could find a place in any garden






