





WROXETER HALL NEWS









Surprises can be either good or bad. Most people prefer a pleasant surprise and sometimes the garden is just the place for pleasant surprises, although less pleasant surprises can be found in gardens too. This year some surprises in my garden are pictured here.

First surprise was the dwarf coreopsis that showed up in a patch of lavender.

Another real surprise was the discovery of a fully double coneflower – it is obviously a natural spontaneous mutation. Somewhat darker in colour than the surrounding coneflowers made it stand out. The stems of the plant are also more red than the usual green.

The same patch had another surprise. A white coneflower in the patch of pink ones.

Some distance away there is a patch of white coneflowers and yes there is a pink one there this year.

My final pleasant surprise was finding a small patch of black eyed Susan in the garden.

How they got there is a mystery, just like the other surprises. I suspect birds are the culprit.

Unpleasant surprises this summer include the resilience and number of weeds that have never required watering, but have been difficult to pull out of the hard baked ground, unlike other garden plants that have

needed regular watering in order to survive.


An all day, gentle ran would bring a great deal of relief to heat stressed plants and trees.






