The Township Office will be closed for Victoria Day on Monday, May 19th, 2025 and re-opening on Tuesday May 20th, 2025 at 8:30 a.m.

FINANCE DEPARTMENT

The next property tax installment due date is May 23, 2025. Payments can be made at the municipal office by cash, cheque or debit. If paying through Online Banking, please add HOWICK TOWNSHIP TAX as a payee account using your

property roll number as the account number. You can also pay by Credit Card, Interac or E-transfer through the Pay Simply link on our website www.howick.ca (a transaction fee applies). For after hours, please use the mail slot located at the front door of the Township Office.

The 2025 Budget has been passed, with an amount to be raised through taxation of \$4,697,132.71. This equates to a municipal tax rate increase of 5.439% plus a 2% capital levy. For the average assessed home in Howick, with an assessment of 210,000, this will mean an increase in municipal tax portion of \$136 for the year 2025. The 2025 Capital Projects include: Fire Equipment, Fire Hall generator, Public Works F450, Wood Chipper, Replacement of Box Culvert #32 on Gorrie Line, Pool Heater and Phase 1 of our Landfill Improvement Project.

HOWICK LANDFILL

Spring is here and summer is upon us and with that comes the extended Landfill Hours. The Howick Landfill located at 45589 Harriston Road (Hwy 87) is now open;

Wednesdays 9 a.m. – 4 p.m. and Saturdays 9 a.m. – 4 p.m.

Brush, leaves and yard waste are accepted at the Howick Landfill at no charge.

GARBAGE & RECYCLING COLLECTION

A friendly reminder that garbage is required to be placed in a Clear/Transparent disposal bag. This includes when dropping your household garbage off at the Howick Landfill. All contents must be visible to curbside collection employees and landfill staff, with the exception of one personal bag within the clear bag. Black bags and un-tagged bags that are left at the curbside will not be picked up by Waste Management. All materials must be properly sorted and at the curb by 7:00 a.m. on your designated collection day to ensure pick-up. Waste Management can change their scheduled route each week. If your garbage/recycling is missed be sure to contact Waste Management directly at 1-888-730-3344.

GORRIE CONSERVATION AUTHORITY

Maitland Valley Conservation Authority will be implementing the Naturalization and Grass Maintenance of the Gorrie Conservation Authority property. Howick Township Council has decided to cease grass cutting and maintenance responsibilities on the north side of the Gorrie Conservation Authority property as this area is not owned by the township. Township staff will only be cutting a buffer strip on either side of the Gorrie Walking Trail in 2025. Contact Maitland Valley Conservation Authority directly if you have any questions or concerns.

CANINE CONTROL

Running at large is defined as a dog found in any place other than the premises of the owner of the dog and not under the control of any person. The Township of Howick would like to remind residents that dogs must be contained to their property by means of a fence, leash, or adequate off-leash training and supervision. Allowing your dog to run at large is a Provincial offence and may result in fines or seizure of the animal.

'Even the bitterest winter contains the seeds of spring' so wrote the playwright in The Winters Tale.

This winter has seemed very long and gardeners are anxiously watching for signs of spring knowing that, as the playwright penned, the seeds of spring are getting ready to appear. Crocuses, grape hyacinths, daffodils and tulips are already growing sturdy leaves that will soon be followed with flowers. These plants have remained dormant underground until the right conditions, light water and warmth stimulate their growth.



One of the miracles of spring is that bulbs, corms, tubers and roots are able to survive months of cold wet and dark environments and grow to be beautiful spring flowers

This winter saw far more damage to the plants in the garden. Strong winds and the weight of snow broke branches and in some cases uprooted trees. Rabbits have girdled many young trees which may not kill the tree but will definitely stunt it's growth. Roses and other shrubs have been "pruned" by deer and other creatures. They too will survive but again their growth will be



shaped by the way they have been cut down.

Many studies have shown that being outdoors, walking in a forest, working in a garden, growing some of your own food or growing beautiful flowers is beneficial to your physical health, mental health and happiness. It may also have an effect on longevity!

What else has so many benefits? Enjoy your garden, it's good for you and the environment.

These early years gave Joyce a deep well of strength, modesty, and practicality that would shape her life. After graduating from high school, Joyce moved to Windsor where she worked at Chrysler's, including a rare cross-border assignment in Detroit. Through a mutual friend, she met Bill Heibein, whom she married in 1966. Together they raised their family Kevin, Heather, Holly, and Pamela—first in London and later in North Bay, Ontario, where they lived until 1986. While raising a bustling household, Joyce found joy in the small things: Bridge games with neighbours, hand-stitched quilts, involvement with the United Church and Canadian Girls in Training (CGIT), and evenings filled with card games like Euchre, Rummoli, and Crokinole. She always had a love for music, which found an outlet when she joined the Baytones women's barbershop-style chorus in North Bay, singing bass and sharing in the warmth of community harmonies. Joyce and Bill also shared a passion for restoring antique furniture and nurturing a flourishing garden. Joyce's lifelong curiosity and love for

travel led her to a career as a travel agent once her daughters were school-aged. She delighted in "fam" trips to destinations like Europe, Thailand, and the Caribbean, and she was known for organizing fun and well-planned theatre outings to Toronto to see Mirvish performances and enjoy the buzz of the "big city."
